The Wayne State campus is well served by transit and Wayne State subsidizes four-hour **Dart** and annual **MoGo** passes for all partand full-time students, allowing them to ride **DDOT** and **SMART** buses, the **QLine** streetcar and MoGo bikes for free! **Scan the QR code to learn more.**



INSIDER TIPS

- The DDOT-4 (Woodward) picks up outside the Mike Ilitch School of Business on Woodward Avenue and Sproat Street. Travel time to Old Main and Main Campus is approximately 15 minutes.
- MoGo is often the most efficient way to get around campus. It takes less than 10 minutes to get from the Integrative Biosciences Center (I-Bio) to Mike Ilitch using the protected bike lane on Cass Avenue.
- The **Transit** app is a great trip-planning tool. It offers suggested routes using real-time info for the QLine, DDOT and SMART. You can even use it to check out MoGo bikes!

GETTING STARTED

There are a lot of fun and exciting things to see and do in and around our Midtown neighborhood and the attractions featured in this guide are a great place to start. Interested in learning more? INSIDER TIPS

- Take a virtual, walking or bus tour led by the City Institute or the Black Scroll Network History & Tours. The tours are led by local guides and highlight the people and places that make Detroit unique.
- Listen to WDET 101.9FM, Detroit's flagship NPR station and a community service of Wayne State. The award-winning station offers a mix of Detroit-focused news, music and cultural content.
- Grow your understanding of the opportunities available throughout the Detroit region and connect with other college students and young professionals via Let's Detroit.

ARTS & CULTURE

Wayne State is located in the heart of Detroit's world-class Cultural Center. The Detroit Institute of Arts (DIA), Detroit Historical Museum, Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History and Michigan Science Center are all within a 10-minute walk from the Wayne State Student Center, offering free or low-cost admission and exciting programming.

The Motown Museum on Grand Boulevard (a 15-minute bike ride or seven-minute drive from the Student Center) is a local favorite. Also worth a trip: the Museum of Contemporary Art Detroit (MOCAD) and Detroit Symphony Orchestra (DSO) on Woodward Avenue between the Cultural Center and Downtown theatre district (the 2nd largest in the U.S. — unofficially).

INSIDER TIPS

- Main Library, the main branch of the Detroit Public Library, sits in the middle of the Cultural Center. Use your WayneState OneCard to check out books for free.
- The Detroit Symphony Orchestra (DSO) offers a Soundcard Student Membership that unlocks their entire season for just \$25!
- Love theatre but can't afford Broadway in Detroit? Wayne State students can attend shows at the new Hilberry Gateway for \$15 (a full season is \$60).







PARKS & RECREATION

There are a number of award-winning parks and public spaces in Detroit.

Ride DDOT or bike to **Belle Isle Park** (both free ways to access the 982-acre island park). The park is home to the Belle Isle Aquarium, Dossin Great Lakes Museum and Oudolf Garden Detroit, designed by renowned Dutch garden designer Piet Oudolf. Visitors can also swim (there is a beach!), fish, paddle and take in spectacular views of Detroit to the north and Canada to the south.

Hop on the QLine and head downtown to the Beach at Campus Martius Park, "a sun-soaked oasis that welcomes visitors May through October." Worried about fitting everything in by October? Don't! The Downtown Detroit Parks (there are multiple!) offer year-round programming, with an outdoor ice-skating rink in Campus Martius beginning in December.

Walk south from Campus Martius through the Woodward Esplanade to Hart Plaza and the Detroit Riverwalk. Head east to explore Milliken State Park and Harbor, the Aretha Franklin Amphitheatre and Robert C. Valade Park, which features an expansive sandy beach and community barbeque pavilion in the summer and "sled shed" in the winter.

INSIDER TIPS

- Campus Martius and the Detroit Riverwalk have both been named the No. 1 public square and riverwalk, respectively, in the U.S. by USA Today.
- Rouge Park in northwest Detroit is more than 200 acres larger than Belle Isle (and both Belle Isle and Rouge Park are larger than Central Park in New York City).
- Detroit is the only U.S. city (outside of Alaska) north of Canada. Taking a day trip to Windsor? Don't forget your passport!

LOCAL SPORTS TEAMS

Detroit is one of only a handful of U.S. cities with teams in each of the Big Four professional sports leagues. The Lions (football) and Tigers (baseball) play downtown and the Pistons (basketball) and Red Wings (hockey) play in Little Caesars Arena (LCA), right next to the Mike Ilitch School of Business. Detroit City Football Club (soccer) games are also a great time; "Le Rouge," as they are affectionately known in Detroit, play at Keyworth Stadium in Hamtramck.

INSIDER TIPS

- The Motor City Cruise (part of the NBA G-League) is an affordable alternative to the Pistons. They play in the Wayne State Fieldhouse.
- Love to play sports? Sign up for a
 Come Play Detroit or Stonewall Sports Detroit league!

GET ENGAGED

There are many nonprofit agencies and community groups doing important work in Detroit. Passionate about environmental justice or youth development?
